

Perfection does not need a Plan-B (Perfection can't get it 'wrong')

Jesus, our elder brother said,
"For whosoever shall do the will of my Father which is in heaven, the same is my brother, and sister, and mother".
Matthew 12:50

"For whosoever shall do the will of God, the same is my brother, and my sister, and mother". Mark 3:35

Of course these scriptures are perfect, and Jesus knew exactly what he was getting at when he spoke these words. I think the important thing to remember here as we read these scriptures is that; Only God and God alone can get it right. For He alone IS Almighty. That's why He is safe and to be trusted, for He is Love and He works all things together in Love for the good of His own creation. He needs no Plan-B. He is perfection and therefore cannot get it 'wrong'. I don't think there is a religion in the whole of the Earth that would perceive God as one that could err. For everybody believes God is infallible. So the Only person who can actually fulfil the will of God is God himself. Yet we know Jesus fulfilled God's will perfectly - so how did he do it, if *only* God himself can fulfil His own will? More importantly, how are WE going to do it? That we may be counted as a brother, sister or mother of Jesus, as his own words say.

When God walked on the planet 2000 years ago he tried to explain the truth to us. The truth of who God is and who we are in relationship to Him. And, He is still doing it to this very day. Not from somewhere out in space, but through his chosen vessels and through the 'things that are made';

For the invisible things of him from the creation of the world are clearly seen, being understood by the things that are made, [even] his eternal power and Godhead; so that they are without excuse: Romans 1:20

Just look at the caterpillar and the butterfly, as one example, if you ask what *things* are being referred to here. And meditate on the depth of such a transformation. Or the lilies of the field - How they grow. Or the birds of the air, how they get fed. Ponder on these things, for they are all God's messengers. They all speak.

Words, formulae and mere information alone is not enough. Yes, hope is wonderful, *and* an important part of the process, for what adult hasn't asked the child, "what do you *hope* to be, when you grow up"? Hope aspires. The child 'hopes' to be a fire-fighter, just like his dad, and I'm sure in many cases that child's hope has been realised, and in adult life his hope has become a reality, and he has indeed attained to his father's position of being a fire-fighter. His 'faith' and his hope has won the day. He persevered to the end and his faith has bought its reward. He IS a fire-fighter.

But here we are aspiring to be like 'our Father'; our heavenly Father. Here we are 'hoping' to be like our big brother Jesus, that we may do The Father's will. But how? Haven't we been trying for the last 2000 years to do it? Haven't we studied, prayed, tithed, fasted etc? Yes we have, but to what avail? What are we missing, what are we lacking, where, (if we are), are we going wrong? What must we do to become a brother, sister, mother?

A complete change of consciousness is what is needed. Or as Jesus himself put it, 'Ye must be born again'.

Why? Why is this so important? Can we not just go to church do our best and love the Lord? Isn't this enough?

Why do we need a complete change of consciousness? Why do we need to be 'born again'?

Because - 'As a man thinketh in his heart, so is he': Prov 23:7.

Here I believe the word thinketh, does not refer to mere imaginings, or wishful, wistful thinking, but a much deeper level of thought. Conscious awareness. For what we are aware of is what is real to us, even if what we are aware of is a lie, it will still be reality to us, and thereby be the truth to us. If you murdered somebody tomorrow (God forbid), I'm sure you would be most surprised, and wonder how on earth you could have done it. Because you do not have the 'conscious awareness' of being a murderer. But you would not be in the least surprised if you 'knew' you were a murderer. For you would say, well of course I murdered (him, her), I'm a murderer what do you expect? Or of course I stole, I'm a thief. Of course I committed adultery, I'm a womaniser, what do you expect? Of course I'm miserable and unhappy, I'm a nobody what do you expect?

Do you see? How significant the perception of oneself truly is? Hence the importance of Paul's statement in Rom 12:2 to, "be ye transformed by the renewing of your mind, that ye may prove what [is] that good, and acceptable, and perfect, will of God.

Clark Kent and Superman, (Kal-El).

I have used this analogy before, but will use it again, for I think it is useful in trying to get over the 'perception' of conscious awareness. I'm convinced that God has created the story of Superman, as a picture for those that have eyes and ears to see just what Jesus was getting at. There cannot be many, men women or children worldwide who do not know the story of Superman and Clark Kent.

Firstly it is important to recognise that the 'real' person/identity (in the story), is Kal-El (Superman's real Kryptonite name, given to him by his parents on planet Krypton). He is a person from another realm, from another planet, from Krypton, he is *not* human. He has abilities far beyond that of mere humans.

Christ is from another realm - He is Spirit, he too is not human, he is from the spirit realm, the Kingdom of Heaven, He too has abilities far beyond mere mortals. Clark Kent is *not* real. Clark Kent is a mask, a disguise, to hide Kal-El's real/true self/identity. Yet to all those that see him, work with him etc, Clark Kent is as real and as far away from Superman, as anybody else is, in everybody's perception of him.

Jesus of Nazereth was a real man, but this too was the mask, the disguise that the Christ used to hide His true identity. And, in Jesus' day they didn't recognise God within the carpenter any more than those at the Daily Planet recognise Kal-El within the news reporter. Do you see the parallel?

Please bear with me, and imagine that Clark Kent, momentarily has amnesia and has totally forgotten his 'real' self. He has lost all recognition and memory of who he really is. There may be some deep inner stirrings in the back of his consciousness, thinking, "I wonder what it would be like to fly! I wonder what it would be like to have super human strength! I wonder what it would be like to have vision that could 'see through', or hearing that can hear what nobody else can hear".

He may think, I wonder why I ponder on such things. He may go even further and just experiment to see if he can levitate 1 inch above the floor, but of course he fails. He cannot do it. Only Superman can do that, and he has forgotten who Kal-El is.

Are you not able to SEE yourself in this analogy? Are you not able to perceive your own mask, your own disguise, your own self delusion/illusion?

I think the other important factor to remember is that when Kal-El is being Superman, and doing his thing, cloak flying in the wind, he is only concerned with the person/person's he is rescuing. At no point does he sit back and consider how he could work this power for his own ends or own self improvement. He has no consciousness of 'self' improvement. He is not looking to better himself. He has no 'self' doubt. He does not rescue one, then question himself whether perhaps he should have rescued someone else on the other side of the Earth. Why not? Because he IS Kal-El - infallible. In fact he is indestructible. "Tear this temple down and I will re-build it in three days" There speaks the voice of one that knows He is indestructible. That's why I headed this article - God has no Plan-B. Superman has no plan-B, he just gets on with it. I think it was Walter Lanyon who coined the phrase - "One with God is a majority". Oh, wonderful, how true. Jesus knew this.

So, what are you going to do? Are you going to be like Clark, and sit pondering on such things, as to what it might be like to fly, or to have strength and confidence, or eyes to see through and ears to hear that which cannot be heard. Or, are you going to this day, put your cloak on and BE your 'real' self. Your Christ self, and watch 'the power' live you, rather than you trying to live IT.

"But put ye on the Lord Jesus Christ, and make not provision for the flesh, to [fulfil] the lusts [thereof]". Romans 13:14.

Put your Cloak on. Your coat of many colours, and see if you do not fly (metaphorically speaking), above this realm of the carnal, flesh thinking mind.

For then you will see that:

"For as many of you as have been baptized into Christ have put on Christ". Gal 3:27.

Then who will you be?

You will be, who you are thinking (knowing, consciously aware of) you are, in your heart?

We have a saying in England when our monarch dies and the heir takes the thrown, it is "The king is dead long live the King". Well Clark Kent is dead long live Kal-El.

Or xxxx xxxx is dead, long live the King - Christ. Put your own name there. "For ye are dead, and your life is hid with Christ in God". Col 3:3

You see we have believed we are the king, we have believed we can do it, but thanks be to Him that gave up His own life willingly, so that now, this king is dead, long live The King.

You see, as I said earlier, information, words, formulas etc, are not enough.

Nothing less than a complete transformation, by your renewed mind, will do it.

It is no good for Clark to wish he was like Superman. He has to become him. You become One with something and you become that thing. I and My Father are One. Not two. Clark Kent and Kal-El are not two separate people, they are One and the same. As long as Clark doesn't forget who he really is. Don't you see brothers and

sisters. We have forgotten, we died when we came to this planet, and were given a fake identity, and all the weaknesses and problems that, that identity attracts.

"But fear not, for I will send my helper to you, and He will bring all things to your remembrance, for you *have* forgotten. And He will bring it all back to you. He will remind you of who YOU really are. Yes, you are in this world, BUT, you are certainly not of it. MY home, is your home". How are you ever gonna fly, if I don't remind you of who you are. How are you ever gonna see or hear, if I don't remind you of who you are. For I AM your confidence and your strength. Let this mind be in you which is also in ME, for YOU have the mind of Christ. Arise and Shine, Super-One; for your Light is come.
