

THE GOOD NEWS...

As you probably all know, the word *gospel* means good news. No one has to tell me that the possibility of me spending eternity in a lake of fire simply because I didn't have the right teachings is good news. Or if I die in deception I'm lost. Or if I for whatever reason do not accept Jesus Christ as my savior I'm doomed to eternal Damnation. I have no excuse, I'm told, if I die without being "saved" While most of the scripture translations teach this, at it's very best it gives me a grotesque picture of God. What the original scriptures teach is the restitution of Gods whole and complete creation.

The doctrine of demons that is referred to as "eternal torment" was invented by Catholicism. It has no place in scripture, and even if it did, I would never accept it. To accept this is to create God in mans own image. That is of course exactly what we've done. I no longer accept something simply because the bible says so. We all, have the truth deep within our Being and we all, will eventually come to where we hear the shepherds voice and when that happens we lose our ability to be a "yes man," or a "parrot."

When that happens we march to our own drums because now we are connected to our true Being and we will no longer listen to the voice of strangers. Now we have gained that ability that Paul spoke of in the book concerning "rightly dividing the word of truth." If I were to speak to the Christian mentality, here are some things I might say. God devised a plan to rescue the prodigal Son, that being humanity. We all were in Adam and in the eyes of wisdom we are not many individual units but all are one.

Time out... I want to make it clear that I never use the scriptures to back up anything I might say. I have perfectly good sound reason for not doing so... that being something I'd rather not go into here. Suffice it to say that for every verse I could give to prove a point, someone else could produce multiple verses that would tend to prove me wrong. What I get out of the scriptures, is totally dependent upon where I am in life. Time out... Paul in Galatians told the churches there that he of the law was blameless. However he spoke of the black letters on white paper, not the moral law. He observed the Sabbath and gave offerings for all his short comings. In this he kept the law. As for the moral law, he himself wrote "the things that I would do, I do not, and the things that I would not, I do, oh woe is me.

I'll continue... so perhaps God said, "once man comes to believe that the blood of this redeemer is once and for all, the total solution for all his sins, past, present and future, sins, {sins incidentally that was in his mind alone,

never in mine, for I created everything perfect as it has always been,} he will then have removed all condemnation from his consciousness. Once this is accomplished, he will then be free to fellowship with me and go on into perfection.
