

WHEN I WOULD DO GOOD...

“Beauty is in the eye of the beholder”. So is sin. This is an old saying that we’ve all heard, that is “Beauty in the eyes of the beholder.” Most of us would whole heartedly agree with this. Why would we agree? Because we know this to be true, it’s a fact. We’ve all known people, some of them might have been friends who fell in love with someone and we thought... “what in the world does he see in her, or what does she see in him” I could tell you of some experience I’ve had in this but I’m going somewhere specifically and I don’t want to take any side trips.

As for Sin, it’s only in the eyes of the sleeping man who sees with dual vision.

I grappled for many years with the Roman chapter seven experience, I’m sure you know what I speak of, you know, “The things that I would do I do not, and the things that I would not do those are the things I always do” etc. I’m not saying this because I think this is where you are. I don’t know where you are, but I am going somewhere and I ask your patience. I’ll get there eventually. I’m going to share some things here that I think might shock you and before you begin to see where this is going I want to build a foundation for what I intend to share with you. The man in Romans seven is at war with a law that he has created as a result of his attempt to be what he already was.

I was reading Romans chapter seven one day and I came to the part where Paul said, “I have found a law then brethren, that when I would do good, evil is present with me”.

I had read Romans chapter seven more then anything else in the bible in my search for the answer as to why my besetting sin hung on like a leach and I could not find a way to get the monkey off my back. I could tell you lots of stories concerning my personal experience of roman seven but not tonight.

After years of fighting this thing the word that finally came was “

? That word was the beginning of my freedom which would not come for a few more years but that day was the beginning. My conscience was clear; I had asked the only one who had the power to help. That help had not come, with the exception of the word that came that day. That day I got clear on one thing. There was a law that worked 24/7 just like gravity that guaranteed one thing. As long as I fought against “Sin” I was guaranteed a loser. I could not overcome this law, for it is one that I myself create by my resistance and my infernal attempts to be what I already am. No one can, no one ever has by resistance. The man who has awakened and is governed by love finds nothing to resist

Shakespeare said it... “Nothing is evil, but thinking makes it so.” **That is how it works!** In my last e-mail to you I said that I prayed for years for the Lord to remove this thing in my life. I also said “He never did!” He never removed any rocks for me, but he has quite sufficiently raised the level of the water. This raising of the water was in terms of eventually granting me the grace to see that the whole concept of sin is in the three dimensional mind. It’s not in the mind of God. Does God know about this that we call sin?

Of course he does, but Gods perception of the sin problem is totally different then mine.

He sees it as nothing more than a miss conception. misconception however, that was keeping his creation man from coming home eventually. Hence the plan of redemption. God has never had one single problem with any part of his creation. He for one needs no one to remind him that his creation is perfect, for he above all, knows that is. It could never be anything else.

Why? Because it was spawned from that which is perfect, and nothing imperfect can possibly come out of something perfect. God has no perception problem. That's always been our problem that redemption is still working to fix. God's redemption is an ongoing process and it's working in and through his creation. We are not being redeemed from sin; we are being redeemed from the belief in it. If I read Genesis chapter three, I read that what constituted mans "Fall" was this Good and evil thing. Nothing more, nothing less. Sin consciousness was the only reason for the whole redemption plan.

If there really was any problem ever in Gods creation then it would be on him, for it was he who was the architect and builder of it. This would be true absolutely. Everything is both true and false and it all depends on my perception as to how I see it. I can look at this thing two ways. #one God made man. Man disobeyed God. If I see it this way, then I have grounds to say this... man was Gods responsibility, so because of love that God is, and because he is the creator of man, then he's obligated to fix it if it's broken.

If the architect designs a building, and then builds it and later there is a problem, a weakness of sorts found in the design, then the one who designed and built it must take full responsibility for any weakness that was found. If my perception sees it this way, then I'll say that the builder ___ take responsibility. He by coming to earth incarnating in the Flawed building fixed it within a 33 year time span and then died to redeem man from the flaw [Law] which was the dual mind which resulted in sin consciousness.

Or... I might see the whole thing this way. God gave the law, not so man would keep it, but so he would break it. I once sat under a very wise bible teacher who taught us that the revealed will of God was that men keep the law. His unrevealed will was that he break it. Would God have known that man would break the law he gave? Of course he would. However man wouldn't know it, man would attempt to keep it. Man would fail and ultimately this law that was his schoolmaster would bring him to Christ. This law ultimately destroys the three dimensional mind which according to spiritual perception is insane.

Man was created perfect. He has always been just exactly as God created him. This is how God has always saw man. Why? Because God has never had a perception problem. This is and has always been mans perception problem, not Gods. So in one sense, man needed no redemption, in that there was no problem with man. So in this sense there was no problem, God saw none and never has. However in another sense there was a problem, at least man perceived that there was. In his faulty perception, he created a problem when there was none. He saw himself as unworthy within himself to approach God.

This was a problem, but the problem was a faulty perception called sin consciousness. The problem was confined only to the mind of man. So now mans problem became Gods problem. Now I'll share a secret with you. Actually God has never had a problem. Not before mans so called fall, or after it. The secret is that mans "fall" was not a fall down, but a fall up. There was a divine method to this madness Adam was The Son of God. If I read the genealogy of Jesus in Luke it begins with Jesus and goes back to Adam.

When it gets to Adam it says The bible does not give us anything but the letter which kills. It is life that teaches and as we gain wisdom from life, it is then; we find the spirit between the lines in the book. God is sovereign over all things. Often that verse in Isaiah comes to mind "Hearken

" There's another verse in Isaiah that comes to mind here that says "

The color changes here speak to me in terms of a perception change.

This happens in my experience when I come to understand that sin is strictly in the eye of the beholder. Personally I have never lost " I'm not supposed to. And knowing this they do not cause me a problem of any condemnation. Paul said it when he said "all things are lawful for me, but all things are not expedient. I believe he said here that he was free to do whatever his conscience would allow. The conscience is a phenonyomon. It's not a "Thing." It begins to be formed as we reach what is called the age of accountability.

As to what age this kicks in, it varies as we are all different, but for all normal children it begins to kick in at a very young age. Usually beginning with parents, then teachers but the big one is mass consciousness. Mass consciousness in our culture is the real builder and creator of our conscience. This is where the "tire meets the road". This is what I must ultimately overcome and rise above and we all will, for it's written in the cards. So am I teaching that it's ok to do whatever feels good? Yes! But only in love.

What I'm saying is that we all have a built in monitor and it's our own particular conscience. Depending where I happen to be on the path my conscience will change from time to time. When I was converted I walked in heavenly places for three months. This is my testimony. I had very little bible knowledge. If I had of been an avid bible reader before my walk with the man, I doubt that my time walking hand in hand with the man with the purple robe would have lasted that long

I was an alcoholic when heaven came down one day, and glory filled my soul. Everything in my lifestyle that was destructive in nature, especially the alcohol was ripped from my grasp. The desire for it was gone and that very day I knew that it was. The only thing was I smoked like a locomotive. Two packs a day and up. All during those three months I walked in the pure awareness of Jesus walking with me, and all this time smoking like crazy. It just didn't seem to affect our relationship at all.

Then I jumped into a Pentecostal church and there I learned that I was " " Now I had a problem! I had been " ." It was very soon after

that that the awareness of the presence of the Lord was gone. Today of course, I realize that it was my defiled conscience that became the problem. Sin consciousness is a weakened conscience. So in a sense I experienced the fall all over again. I walked with God, I was filled with the joy of his presence and then [as Paul stated in Romans chapter seven] the law came in and I died.

Paul says in this chapter... "For I was alive without the law once but when the commandment came, sin revived, and I died. Nothing real can ever die. The only thing the law does is it eliminates the old creation man who believed he needed to be what he already was. He came to believe that he and the Father were two. Here is my personal "rule of thumb." My conscience allows me to do anything I desire to do as long as I do not hurt anyone in whatever I do. I think of a verse that says, _____

I may do something in secret that my conscience allows, that will not hurt another. For example, if I still smoked, I would not do it in the presence of some, because they would be offended. So then, love is the keeping of the whole law. If love motivates me, although I'm free to do all things, if love is my motivating influence, my conscience will not permit me to do what may bring pain to someone else. I rarely have a problem with conscience unless I realize I have acted out of love concerning a fellow human being. When that happens I make restitution in whatever way I can. Then my peace returns.

There was a time when I was afraid to even look at the opposite sex for fear of "lust" entering through the eye gate. Today to me the word lust is a word that is no longer in my vocabulary. To me, it's perfectly normal to appreciate a beautiful woman. And yes, of course, there are sometimes desires that may arise on certain occasions. What prevents me from acting on these impulses is not any belief in a God who will one day judge me, for that God doesn't exist in my belief system today.

It's just that there's a woman in my life who thinks I walk on water and if I hurt her in that way, I would have a difficult time digging myself out of the hole my conscience would bury me in. I probably never would forget hurting someone who deeply loves me the way she does. If on the other hand I was alone and without a companion and I saw a woman that in my eyes was beautiful I'd have no problem with attempting to get to know her and no problem as to wherever that might lead.

Whatever two adults mutually agree on I see no problem with whatsoever. Whatever they do is on them. I do understand your concern about some you know that apparently teach that as long as you love [Whatever that means?] it's ok to have sex or whatever. I understand this. If it was me, and it's not, it would not bother me. I cannot know what is in another's mind or why they do what they do. Sometimes I don't know why I do some of the dumb things I do.

As for me, I steer clear of anything that comes close to judging anyone to be wrong or do wrong because to sew those seeds means I'll not like what eventually grows in my own back yard. Also here is something I've watched that seems to be a law. Everything that I've ever judged someone else for, I later find that I have did that very same thing, and

even after I've done so much judging. I'm not at all saying that you're judging here. Please don't misunderstand me. If I was, would I not then be judging you? I'm sharing much of this in hopes you might get to know me a little better and perhaps find something in all of this you might use.

While I'm here in this flesh I am a biological being that have biological needs. If these needs are short circuited for any reason then I'm resisting nature, I'm denying a God given need, and I will suffer some consequence as a result. We are in the flesh not to resist it, but to love it and nurture it and it's my belief that we should in whatever way possible not deny its natural urges, but to indulge in all its deliciousness. Because of the influence of a fallen religion we have denied the nature of our own body.

Again, all things are lawful for me, but all things do not edify me or build me up. This is where again my conscience comes into play. The bible [Which is what so many base their lives on], teaches me that a man stands or falls according to his own conscience. I am not responsible for your conscience, I can only follow my own if I desire to. I do in fact desire to because it will keep me in the realm of fellowship which usually translates to me as peace. I never deny the biological needs of the body, unless intuition nudges me. intuition will sometimes come into play and lead you in a way your mind would not normally go.

Whatever I do if I'm motivated by love should not hurt another. If when you were first converted and your were taught as you say, that you could sleep around that you would have had a hay day, the only judgment you would have incurred would have been from your own mind, unless you really believed that this was alright. However rest assured sooner or later someone, we'll call the "Sabbath Patrol," would have set you down and told you how God would judge you for what you were doing, and then the hay day would have went away and taken you peace with it.

The scripture speaks of two laws which are actually the same law. James speaks of the perfect law of liberty, and then there's the Law of Moses. When speaking of love it says "against such there is no law. The law was created for the man who's still sleeping, for he's the lawless man. He's the man who doesn't know who he is. The Law of Moses has no effect on the man who has come into love. The law of love operates in the heart of the one who is conscious.

The Law of Moses is geared to incite me to break it. It's all in the plan. As I awaken metamorphous is taking place, and that that has wings is splitting open the cocoon, the old paradigms and they are suddenly going to find themselves in a new world order. Not the one that those who would control us would in their frenzy create for the purpose of enslaving us. No! This light which is the Christ has been circling the globe as I write this is coming to earth. When it reaches critical mass, the new world order will commence.
