

## **INFINITE LOVE**

Nowhere in the Bible is God's Love described as "Infinite". The closest we come to this description is "perfect" Love, and this term was used by the apostle John in 1 John 4:18 when he explained that perfect Love casts out fear.

But to those who have, by God's grace, been ushered into the realm fo His Love, there is scarcely any other way to express it other than "Infinite".

I had this experience in August of 2006, and the purpose of this paper is to describe it to you, so you can better appreciate what a truly awesome God we have, and know the Truth about your true Self.

My powerful, supernatural born-again experience occurred on 1/7/95, at about 10:30 AM, at Bethel Colony of Mercy in Lenoir, NC. It is a religious-based operation that is for alcoholics and drug addicts, and I was there for a severe addiction to crack cocaine.

Concerning the experience of Infinite Love, let me first state that Jesus said that the first and greatest commandment is to "Love the Lord thy God with all thy heart, and with all thy soul, and with all thy mind." (Matthew 22:37)

I mention this only because there are tests that God puts us through, and while I am speaking only from experience, I believe I am speaking Truth when I say that an individual will, from the very deepest parts of their being, express with all sincerity to God that they Love Him more than anything, most certainly including their career, family, and even their life itself before He will *reveal the Truth of their Being to them.*

Now I will tell you the test presented to me , and how, by His grace, I passed and was ushered into this unspeakable realm.

I begin by mentioning that I was "never much with the ladies", and have had few relationships in my life, none lasting more than a few months. This is important because a most remarkable thing happened to me concerning an attractive young woman bartender who took a strong liking to me. She bought me drinks, told me that she liked me a lot, and confided some of her secrets to me. I am a human being, and of course the idea of having sex with her entered my mind. But I was conflicted because I felt that I had experienced her wonderful Spirit in our conversations, and didn't know how to proceed with her (let her know that we were to Love each other in the Spirit first and possibly not be intimate until marriage, or try for physical intimacy early on).

After much soul-searching, I decided not to take advantage of what might have been an easy situation or opportunity, but rather to maintain our relationship on a friendship level. To put it another way, I made the decision that I was going to Love her *Spirit* (the God in her) more than her flesh.

And at the very moment that I, from the deepest recesses of my being, decided this, the ushering in began to take place.

I was standing in my apartment when all of the sudden the Spirit took over, and I closed my eyes and immediately knew that I was having an experience in God.

All I could “see” (my eyes were closed) was a very faint off-white color with the slightest hint of pink in it (very peaceful). Then, even though I was standing still, it felt as though I was moving deeper and deeper in this realm.

Before long, I realized that I was indeed in the midst of the Love of God, but then a most amazing thing happened. Small black dots began appearing, but would immediately disappear, and perfect peace was restored. Very quickly I realized that these were sins being instantaneously forgiven in this Infinite Love. Then a very large, irregular black “splotch” showed up and I knew right away that it was like a Hitler got loose in the world, and ten, 20 million died. But it too was instantaneously removed (forgiven), and peace was restored. Then Father informed me (not by audible words, just a “knowing”) that in His Infinite Love everything is forgiven:

- 1) Instantaneously
- 2) No questions asked
- 3) Never to be thought of again.

**EVERYTHING.**

Does this seem too good to be true? Well don’t you know that this is exactly what the Bible says in Matthew 12:31-32? This particular Truth cannot be found in the King James Version, because this passage is riddled with errors (the KJV is generally a strong translation and I use it frequently, but it is just true that there are many errors in it).

Instead we turn to the ultra-accurate Concordant Literal New Testament (CLNT: phone number 661-252-2112) for this Truth.

Matthew 12:31-32(CLNT): (Jesus speaking): “Therefore I am saying to you, every sin and blasphemy will be pardoned men, yet the blasphemy of the Spirit shall not be pardoned. (32) And whoever may be saying a word against the Son of Mankind, it will be pardoned him, yet whoever may be saying aught against the Holy Spirit, it shall not be pardoned him, neither in this age, nor in that which is impending.”

Well, it sounds like there is an unforgivable sin, but I will discuss that second.

The first thing I want to discuss are the eight words “... every sin and blasphemy will be pardoned men...”

Could these words possibly mean what they say? Mass murder? Genocide? Torture? Rape? Terrorism? Could it possibly mean what it says?

Precious reader, can't you see that this matches up perfectly with what I experienced while in the realm of Perfect Love? My experience matches the Word of God exactly!

Now to the supposed unforgivable sin, the blasphemy of the Holy Spirit. To see how this can be forgiven at this time, it is very important to understand that God deals with mankind in periods of time called "ages". For example, look at what Paul says in Ephesians 2:7.

"That in the ages to come He might show the exceeding riches of His grace in His kindness toward us in Christ Jesus."

The salient point is that Jesus lived in a certain age which some call "the age of Law". But most Christians agree that a new age came at the first feast of the Pentecost after Jesus' resurrection, when the Apostles had "cloven tongues like as of fire" sit on them, "And they were all filled with the Holy Ghost and began to speak in other tongues..." (Acts 2:3,4). Some call this the beginning of the "church", or the "Pentecostal" age.

So these are the two ages spoken of by Jesus when He said "...neither in this age nor in that which is impending..."

But now we are entering another age, which I prefer to call the "Kingdom" age, and so the time limit that Jesus gave for the unforgiveness of the blasphemy of the Holy Spirit has expired. In this age, the Kingdom age, everything is forgiven, even the blasphemy of the Holy Spirit.

Still not convinced? Then let's look at a real-life tragedy that happened recently.. The incident I am speaking of is the madman that murdered those young Amish girls that was in the news.

What was the Amish response? THEY FORGAVE, UNCONDITIONALLY. Now if human beings have the grace to forgive something like this, what do you suppose God forgives?

The final revelation of my Infinite Love experience was the most beautiful, and it occurred as soon as I comprehended that all was forgiven by Infinite Love. By now I was in total communication with my God, and He told me, over a period of maybe 10 to fifteen seconds, that I was the Infinite Love that I had experienced. And oh, beloved, don't you know if it's true for me *then it's true for you too?* How could it be any other way?

Don't you see? Our Spirit is who we really are and our Spirit is One with the Almighty (John 17:21-23 and 1 Corinthians 6:17), so how could we be anything but the Infinite Love that He is?

A couple more points and I will end. The first few days after this experience, I began to realize that while I was in this realm, I was only aware that I was being Loved; there was no good or evil, and surprisingly to me I was not conscious of Jesus! Why? Wouldn't be His realm?

But did you know that Jesus does not reign forever? He said so Himself in Luke 22:37:  
“...the things concerning Me have an end”.

And Paul said in 1Corinthians 15:25 "For He must reign until He hath put all enemies under His feet."

How can this be? It's really quite simple. Jesus' job was to take away the sin of the world (John 1:29) and actually be made sin for us (2 Corinthians 5:21).

Well, there is no sin in the realm of Infinite Love because of infinite forgiveness, and so why is a Christ needed to take away sin where there is no sin?

The final point I'll make is that I understand now what Paul said in Philippians 1:23: "For I am in a strait between two having the desire to depart, and to be with Christ, which is far better".

All I can say is that once you experience the Infinite Love of God, you crave to be there. I suppose the challenge for all of us is to live in this realm while still on earth, much as Mother Theresa did.

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
